MID YEAR REPORTS

Student learning progress reports will be sent home in the last week of this term. Please take the time to discuss these with your child/ren and take the opportunity to make a time to meet with your chil/ren's class teacher early in Term 3.

We know that children learn much more successfully when the school and families work together.

DAILY PROGRAM CHANGE

As from Term 3 we will be making some changes to our daily program. Our **DEAR** (Drop Everything and Read) program will be later in the day. **Lesson 1 will begin promptly at 8:45am**. Students will need to be in their classrooms by 8:40am so they are ready to learn.

The effect of being "just a bit late" every day...

If a student arrives at 9:00am they are 15 minutes late for learning.

If they are late regularly the impact on loss of valuable learning time is significant and does affect their success as learners.

- After 1 week they have lost 75 minutes or 1 hour 15 minutes of learning
- After a term they have lost 750 minutes or 12 ½ hours of learning
- After a year they have lost 3,000.00 minutes or 50 hours of learning.

All students should be at school ready to learn by 8:45.
