
AROUND OUR SCHOOL

Dan McGuiness Visit

As part of our Book Week celebrations our Year 2–7 students were treated to a visit from author and illustrator, Dan McGuiness. Dan has written his own graphic novel series, Pilot and Huxley, and has illustrated many other books, including Anh Do's, Hot Dog series. Dan shared with us his story and his inspirations for taking up drawing. He helped our students see how creative they all already are. Calling upon students' ideas, they together drew amazingly whacky characters living in some very unusual places.

Our students came away from the visit with an understanding that whatever they create is right! There is no wrong way to be creative—so just go for it! Dan taught us some great drawing tips too. Like adding a horizon line to our drawings when creating a background—everything above the line is in the sky and everything below is on the ground. With helpful tips like these and Dan's words of encouragement, it wouldn't be a surprise if we have some new graphic novelists popping up at Hampstead Primary School in the future.
