Term Overview

During the first week of this term, we will be looking at resilience skills. Resilience and wellbeing are essential for both academic and social development. Children who are confident, resilient and emotionally intelligent perform better academically, and these skills can contribute to the maintenance of healthy relationships and responsible lifestyles. We will look specifically at using humour in a helpful way, recognizing our own strengths and limitations, using empathy, using leadership skills, and setting SMART goals. You can support your child by letting them know when you see them demonstrating these skills in their daily life. This topic links strongly with our learning in the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum, with this term's focus being on Protective Strategies. Please chat to your kids about their learning in this.

In Mathematics, we are focusing particularly on fractions, decimals and percentages, as well as chance.

In English, students have chosen to study the novel I am Sasha, reading from a digital copy, while listening to the audiobook. In writing, we will be working on Narratives. During our Guided Reading groups, we will be learning about different types of Natural Disasters, which will further support the Science learning. We will also be strengthening our 'During Reading Strategies' that good readers use.

Students will be looking at Growth and Development as part of Health and PE, and we will develop our Cricket skills. The Arts will continue to be run by a specialist teacher and students will be looking at the area of Visual Arts, while in Science, students
