Mathematics Money

-Recognise, describe and order

Australian coins according to their value.

Statistics & Probability

-Answer yes/no questions to collect information and make simple inferences.

_Identify outcomes of familiar events involving chance and describe them using everyday language such as 'will happen', 'won't happen' or 'might happen'.

-Represent data with objects and drawings where one object or drawing represents one data value. Describe the displays.

Processes of Counting/ Number

- Establish understanding of the language and processes of counting by naming numbers in sequences, initially to and from 20, moving from any starting point

- Count collections to 100 by partitioning numbers using place value.

-Represent and solve simple addition and subtraction problems using a range of strategies including counting on, partitioning and rearranging parts.

English

Writing

This term we will look at Non-Fiction texts and how they are structured. With this, students will also have the opportunity to write in authentic contexts that are meaningful to them through book making.

Phonics & Phonological Awareness

Students are divided between Room 13, 14 and 18 to learn about the relationship between letters and sounds and develop their phonemic awareness.

Guided Reading

Small group work with teacher to develop concepts of print, reading comprehension and learn new reading strategies.

D.E.A.R (Drop Everything and Read)

Each day we set aside 15 minutes to read independently, develop fluency and practice new reading strategies learnt in guided reading.
